Welcoming the New UMSOD Dean

Meet Dean Laurie McCauley,

Dr. Laurie McCauley, DDS, MS, PhD, is the 14th dean of the University of Michigan School of Dentistry, and the first woman to hold this important post. A native of Ohio and an OSU graduate, Dean McCauley has been 'true Blue' since joining the U-M School of Dentistry faculty in 1992.

Dr. McCauley earned her professional degrees from The Ohio State University – a Doctor of Dental Surgery (1985); a Master of Science in dentistry (1988); and a PhD in veterinary pathobiology (1991).

She built her academic career on a foundation of clinical teaching, clinical practice and scientific inquiry and has risen through the academic ranks to the position of full professor in both the School of Dentistry and the Department of Pathology at the U-M Medical School. In 2002 she was named the William K. and Mary Ann Najjar Professor of Periodontics, the same year she became department chair of Periodontics and Oral Medicine, a post she held for 10 years.

A seasoned academic administrator, McCauley brings a unique blend of clinical experience, classroom leadership, research achievement, and administrative success to the position. She continues to see patients in the School's faculty practice and work in her research lab as time permits.

The recipient of numerous awards and hon-

ors includes: a Fellow in the American Association for the Advancement of Science (2007) and recognized with the *Basic Research in Biological Mineralization Award* from the International Association for Dental Research (2011), the *William J. Gies Award* from the American Dental Education Association (2010), and the *Paula Stern Achievement Award* from the American Society for Bone and Mineral Research (2010).

The school is fortunate to be able to pass the baton to such a gifted educator, clinician, and researcher and to someone who is a strategic thinker, is detail oriented, and seeks ideas and opinions from others. She will be busy in the coming months meeting with alums and colleagues in many of the dental societies and study clubs around the state and looks forward to meeting you.

Furthermore, after a nationwide search, as of 9/15/2013 WDDS member, Dr. Renee Duff has been appointed Assistant Dean for Student Services. Dr. Duff succeeds WDDS member, Dr. Marilyn Woolfolk who served in this position, and previously as director of student affairs, since 1990. Dr. Woolfolk retired from the School of Dentistry in August, 2013.

Speaker Bio:

Dr. Beard received his Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Washington in Seattle; his DDS degree from Washington University Dental School in St. Louis; and his M.S. degree in prosthodontics from the University of Michigan. He has taught for over 30 years in graduate and undergraduate prosthodontics at the University Of Michigan while maintaining a part time private practice. Dr. Beard's research has revolved around mandibular movements of muscle dysfunction and dental ceramics. He has presented to numerous organizations in and out of the country lecturing and publishing on these topics. As a member of many dental organizations he has strong ties to the Washtenaw District Dental Society.

Course Overview:

Is centric relation dead? It is surely changing and not a constant. How precise a position is it? And when is it useful? From dental students to season dentists, clinicians fear centric relation due to not understanding it. It becomes hard to grasp the meaning when the definition has changed multiple times over the past 40 years. Does that mean centric relation has changed or is it only your observations of it? Without teeth, centric relation is the only starting point to restore a dentition. This makes it critical that we understand this position so that it can be recorded. Dr. Aronovich is the assistant program director of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residency program. He obtained his dental degree from McGill University, residency training in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the Hospital of Saint Raphael/Yale-New Haven Hospital, and a fellowship in Pediatric Craniomaxillofacial Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center. His clinical interests include orthognathic surgery, cleft lip and palate, reconstructive surgery, surgical management of TMJ disorders, sleep apnea, implantology, and facial trauma with research interests including clinical outcomes in orthognathic surgery, wound healing, and outcomes in the surgical management of TMJ disorders Comprehensive Management of TMD: From confusion to clarity.

Overview & Learning Objectives:

This course is intended to provide an overview of pain mechanisms in the orofacial region, as well as an evidence-based approach to the management of temporomandibular disorders. This course qualifies for 1CE of pain management. Objectives include:

- 1. To understand the multifactorial nature of TMD, and review current knowledge on its pathogenesis.

MDA Governance Update

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

01H-913 (Adopted as Amended)

Resolved, that the MDA form a Nominating Committee to

- ·Provide nominations for officers, MDA trustee positions and delegates/alternates to the ADA
- ·Vet candidates by following a predetermined set of criteria (i.e., diversity such as geographic, qualifications, etc.), established by the House of Delegates,

And be it further

Resolved, that the committee be comprised of the following:

- Twelve people (one from each region), selected by the MDA Region, with the MDA immediate past president serving as chair
- ·Regions should consider selecting from the following pool: past MDA presidents, former or current MDA delegates, former MDA board members
- Sitting Board members should not serve on the committee with the exception of the immediate past president

·Nominating Committee can submit more nominees than the number of openings

COMBINING THE SECRETARY/TREASURER POSITIONS

02H-913 (Adopted)

Resolved, that the MDA combine the secretary and treasurer positions and that this officer position be elected by the House of Delegates beginning in 2015.
